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- Though the sales this year have been broadly on a par with 2023 a worrying trend is a drop in the clearance rate (percentage sold/catalogued) across virtually all the major sales including April's three major sales so far: Sydney Easter Yearlings in Australia; OBS Spring (April) 2-Year-Olds in Ocala; and Tattersalls' Craven 2yo Sale in Newmarket. The top is fine but it's getting tougher to sell them below there.
- I Am Invincible, who is \$9.6-million in front for his third consecutive Australian Sire Championship and threatening Snitzel's all-time earnings record of \$29.2-million, was the leading sire by average (71 averaged A\$589,639) at the major Australasian yearling sales through Sydney Easter April 7-8. Extreme Choice (32/\$522,969) was second, ahead of Zoustar (79/\$503,829); Frankel (14/\$503,571), covering Southern Hemisphere time; and Snitzel (82/\$493,409). Wootton Bassett's first Southern Hemisphere crop averaged \$379,750 with 72 sold, while 2020 G1 Golden Slipper winner Farnan (66/\$242,974) topped 'true' first-crop sires.
- Though with only three sold so far, Justify (3/\$541,666) is the leading sire with 3+ sold at the US 2yo sales, just ahead of Into Mischief (5/\$541,000); Tapit (6/\$447,000) is third, ahead of Uncle Mo (13/\$385,538) and Not This Time (13/\$362,114). Tiz The Law (15/\$337,666), sire of the \$1.9-million April sale-topper, is the leading first-crop sire, ahead of Florida's Ocala Stud's Win Win Win (8/\$325,875), sire of the \$1.8-million OBS March sale-topper. Donato Lanni bought six of the top seven at OBS April, all to go to Bob Baffert. Crestwood Farm's first-crop son of Uncle Mo, Caracaro, has had 14 sell for an \$80,000 median, over 12 times his \$6,500 fee.

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INTRODUCTION

There have been three major sales so far this month: the Inglis Sydney Easter sale which finishes up the major Australasian yearling sale market; Tattersalls Craven 2yo Sale in Newmarket, England, which provides a barometer for the European 2yo In Training sales; and the OBS Spring (or April) 2yo Sale which had over 1200 horses catalogued, making it the biggest 2yo marketplace in North America. The three sales had one metric in common, whether they were up or down in gross and average: the clearance rate, which we define as the percentage sold from those catalogued, dropped in all three sales. This is significant.

There are two really big yearling sales in Australia: the Magic Millions Sale in January, which is the highestgrossing sale in Australasia, and the Sydney Easter sale at the beginning of April, which has the highest average; between them they accounted for 62% of the Australasian yearling market. This year Sydney Easter got an \$A10-million boost when one of the partners bought out the other two for the record-breaking Pierro filly out of Winx, and the sale finished up with a 9% increase in gross and 10% increase in average over the 2023 edition – though the gross was still A\$1m below the 2022 record of A\$153-million. Overall, the major Australasian yearling sales saw 4,119 yearlings sold for A\$630,978,000 and an average of \$153,187; boosted by a big recovery at the Karaka sale in New Zealand, the gross was up A\$5-million over 2023, while the average was virtually unchanged – but the 2024 gross was 6% below the record gross of A\$671-million in 2022 and the average was 4% lower than the \$159,773 record that year.

In 2023 OBS owned 82% of the North American 2yo market. The recently-concluded Spring (April) sale has had virtually the same average - +/- \$130,100 - for the last three years. This year the number catalogued was 2% below the 2023 sale but the number sold and gross were each down 11% due to the clearance rate from the catalogue (sold/cat) being down 4.9% from 57.1% last year to 52.2% this year. For OBS March and April combined, the number catalogued was virtually the same but the gross dropped by 8% and the average by 2% as the percentage sold from the catalogue dropped 3.6% for the two sales combined. Similarly the Craven 2yo Sale at Newmarket saw a 3.5% drop in the clearance rate. In Australasia the Easter Sale saw a 7.4% drop in percentage sold from the catalogue; overall the clearance rate for the Australasian sales dropped 2.8%, but was down 4.5% from 2022, when 76.7% of the yearlings catalogued were sold, versus 72.2% this year.

While the prices for those sold across all these sales remained more or less stable the consistent drop in the clearance rate raises red flags; there is plenty of talk about polarization in the market, and these figures document that breeders and consignors are finding it tougher to get horses sold. It's a worrying trend.

SECTION 1: AUSTRALASIAN SALES

I AM INVINCIBLE THE TOP SIRE BY YEARLING AVERAGE IN AUSTRALASIA 2024

After April 20 racing I Am Invincible had 2023/24 seasonal earnings of A\$28,214,582, over \$9.6-million ahead of Zoustar, Pride of Dubai, and So You Think, and just over \$1-million shy of the all-time sire earnings record of A\$29.243,613 registered by **Snitzel** in the 2017-18 season. It's a certainty that 'Vinnie' will break that record and he locked up his third consecutive Leading Sire title months ago.

No surprise then that I Am Invincible was the leading sire by yearling average among sires with 2+ sold at the Australasian yearling sales through Sydney Easter, with 71 yearlings averaging A\$589,639. He led ten stallions with 2024 yearling averages over A\$300,000; six of the ten were Australian-bred, including two reverse shuttlers, two were Coolmore shuttlers from the Northern Hemisphere, and two were Juddmonte sires who covered mares Southern Hemisphere time.

Four sires averaged over A\$500,000; besides I Am Invincible these were the extremely good but subfertile **Extreme Choice** (32/\$522,969); future champion sire **Zoustar** (79/\$503,829), who reverse-shuttled to England for four seasons; and Juddmonte's World Number One or Two **Frankel**, who had 14 yearlings sell in Australasia for a \$503,571 average. Then came, in order, **Snitzel** (82/\$493,409); Juddmonte's **Kingman** (4/\$405,230); **Pierro** (44/\$380,868); shuttlers **Wootton Bassett** (72/\$379,750) and **Justify** (35/\$376,040); and the recently-retired former reverse shuttler **Exceed And Excel** (24/\$337,500).

Wootton Bassett qualifies as the leading first-crop sire, and he does have his first Coolmore-sired 2yo's in the Northern Hemisphere this year after nine seasons at France's Haras d'Etreham. He was among 12 first-crop yearling sires who averaged over \$90,000. Clear leader among the other eleven was Kia Ora Stud's 2020 G1 Golden Slipper winner Farnan, like Extreme Choice and Anders by Not A Single Doubt; he had 66 yearlings average \$242,974. Others with six-figure averages were: Vinery's Ole Kirk (64/\$161,336), by Written Tycoon out of a full sister to Black Caviar and winner of the G1 Golden Rose (1400m) and G1 Caulfield Guineas (1600m) as a spring 3yo in 2020; Cambridge Stud NZ's Hello Youmzain (46/\$149,857), a dual G1 6-furlong winner (Haydock Sprint Cup, Royal Ascot Diamond Jubilee) in England by Kodiac who shuttles from Haras d'Etreham; Darley's Bivouac (58/\$132,112) a three-time G1 winner at 1200m-1400m by Exceed And Excel; Arrowfield's shuttler from Japan, Admire Mars (21/\$117,410), a two time 1m G1 winner in Japan and Hong Kong by Daiwa Major; and Coolmore's King's Legacy (71/\$115,205), one of the last major sons to stud by the great Redoute's Choice and winner of the G1 Sires Produce and G1 Champagne S. at Randwick in 2020. And five first-crop sires averaged in the 90's: Ghaiyyath (14/\$99,829); Prague (18/\$97,222); North Pacific (50/\$93,136); Russian Camelot (17/\$91,949); and Anders (50/\$91,514).

JUSTIFY EDGES OUT INTO MISCHIEF BY 2YO SALE AVERAGE THOUGH FEW SOLD

Though Good Magic in particular is proving to also be in the top drawer among a strong group of North American F2020 sires, **Justify** is proving to be a Top Five young sire, along with F2018 Not This Time and F2019 Gun Runner. Just in the last three weeks he has had a 3yo G2 winner at Keeneland, a new 3yo SW last weekend at Oaklawn, and three 3yo's run second in G1's. He now has 22 Black-Type Winners (BTW), 14 GSW, and six G1 winners with his first crop now 4yo's. Though he's only had three 2yo's sell at the Two-Year-Old In Training sales so far they have averaged \$541,666, barely edging out Into Mischief (5/\$541,000), who has already locked up his sixth consecutive sires' championship, as leading sire by average at the North American 2yo sales through Ocala April (Spring). Tapit was third by average, with six sold for an average of \$447,000.

Uncle Mo, with 13 two-year-olds averaging \$385,538, and F2018 Not This Time, with 13 averaging \$362,124 from his fifth crop, off a \$40,000 stud fee (thus topping the charts on the profitability scale), posted the highest averages among sires with ten or more sold. Not far behind them were F2018 number two Nyquist (21/\$339,619) and the leading first-crop sale sire so far, Tiz The Law, who's had 15 two-year-olds average \$337,666 including the OBS Spring \$1.9-million sale-topper. He is just a tick ahead of Florida's Ocala Stud's Win Win Win (8/\$325,875), a son of Hat Trick who won the G1 Forego as a 4yo in his final career start for breeder Live Oak Stud and had the OBS March sale-

topper, a \$1.8-million filly bought by Donato Lanni for Zedan Racing to go to Mr. Baffert. Another four-figure stud fee first-crop sire, Buck Pond's Shancelot, had a \$650,000 colt at OBS March and has averaged \$299,000 with just three sold. Shancelot is a son of Shanghai Bobby who won the G2 Amsterdam and was subsequently second in three G1's including the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint. He was trained by Jorge Navarro, but that doesn't necessarily mean he won't be a sire.

It's quite a salty-looking group of freshman sires and another ten of them have averaged over \$100,000 so far with ten or more 2-year-olds sold, in order: McKinzie (26/\$214,211); Authentic (21/\$173,523); Caracaro (14/\$157,428); Vekoma (32/\$138,000); Game Winner (19/\$127,894); Improbable (25/\$124,055); Complexity (23/\$110,521); Global Campaign (27/\$105,074); **Honor A.P.** (12/\$103,250); and **War Of** Will (12/\$103,000). Only one of these stands for a fourfigure stud fee: Caracaro, a son of Uncle Mo who ran second by a neck to Country Grammer in the G3 Peter Pan and a 5 1/2-length second to Tiz The Law in the G1 Travers as a 3yo in 2020 but never ran thereafter and made only four lifetime starts for no stakes wins. Pope McLean's Crestwood Farm stands him for \$6,500 and they must be walking on the moon after he had a filly sell in April for \$775,000, three other 2yo's bring \$225,000-\$300,000, and an \$80,000 median - over 12 times his stud fee – with 14 sold. We'll bet his book has got bigger in the last week or so; it certainly should based on these results.
